# HPEC Notices of Motion for the AGM (May 1, 2015)

### **Part B Constitution**

### 6.0 Officers:

Current:

6.3 Elections shall be held annually; even year elections will be held for

the positions of President-Elect, Vice-President (2) and odd year elections will be held for the positions of Secretary and Vice-President (1) and Vice-President (3).

### Proposed:

Be it resolved that section 6.3 of the constitution be amended to read 6.3 Elections shall be held annually; even year elections will be held for the positions of Secretary, Vice-President (2) and odd year elections will be held for the positions of President-Elect, Vice-President (1) and Vice-President (3).

Rationale: The proposed change allows for HPEC officer elections to align with the HPEC executive structural changes, initiated in 2012/13, for a two-year term president. The change allows for two HPEC officers to be elected in even years and three HPEC officers to be elected in odd years.

### 7.0 Executive:

Current:

- 7.1 The Table Officers shall consist of:
- a. The officers of the council.
- b. Representatives of the Provincial Executive Council of Alberta Teachers' Association who shall be:
- (i) A PEC liaison appointed by the Provincial Executive Council of the Alberta Teachers' Association and be a voting member of all council committees.
- (ii) A staff advisor appointed by the Executive Secretary of the Alberta Teachers' Association and be a voting member of all council committees.



- c. The Ever Active Schools Liaison.
- d. and the Ever Active Schools Director who shall be a non-voting member of this council.

### Proposed:

Be it resolved that section 7.1 of the constitution be amended to read 7.1 The Table Officers shall consist of

- a. The officers of the council,
- b. Representatives of the Provincial Executive Council of the Alberta Teachers' Association, who shall be
- (i) A PEC liaison appointed by the Provincial Executive Council of the Alberta Teachers' Association and be a voting member of all council committees

(ii) A staff advisor appointed by the Executive Secretary of the Alberta Teachers' Association and be a voting member of all council committees

#### and

c. the Ever Active Schools Director, who shall be a nonvoting member of this council.

Rationale: The proposed change eliminates the position of Ever Active Schools Liaison. The current structure of Ever Active Schools requires a direct link from the Ever Active Schools Director to the HPEC president, thereby removing the need for a liaison position between HPEC table officers and Ever Active Schools.




